Instructions for Authors

The Neurodiagnostic Journal uses Editorial Manager to receive and peer review manuscript submissions. Authors who are interested in submitting an article for consideration of publication in *The Neurodiagnostic Journal* may access Editorial Manager at <http://www.editorialmanager.com/tnj>.

All submissions must be prepared in the format described in “Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals: Writing and Editing for Biomedical Publication.” These guidelines can be found at ICMJE.org. Manuscripts that do not conform to these guidelines will be returned to the author(s).

As an author you are required to secure permission to reproduce any figure, table or extract text from any other source. This applies to direct reproduction as well as "derivative reproduction" (where you have created a new figure or table which derives substantially from a copyrighted source). Authors are advised that no substantive revisions of the manuscript can be made after acceptance by the Editor for publication.

Manuscript Requirements:

- Typewritten double-spaced
- Margins of at least one inch on all sides
- Number manuscript pages consecutively throughout the paper
- Title page: Name, address, and phone number of the corresponding author, and email addresses of all coauthors
- Suitable Running Head: A shortened version of the title not exceeding 50 character spaces
- Abstract: Summary not exceeding 250 words. Avoid abbreviations, diagrams, and reference to the text in the abstract.

- **Key Words:** Up to 5 key words. Each ‘word’ can contain multiple words, for example, “Somatosensory Evoked Potentials” is considered one word, separated from other key words using a semi-colon.

Illustrations

Illustrations submitted (line drawings, halftones, photos, photomicrographs, etc.) should be clean originals or digital files. Digital files are recommended for highest quality reproduction and should follow these guidelines:

- 300 dpi or higher
- Sized to fit on journal page
- EPS, TIFF, or PSD format only
- Submitted as separate files, not embedded in text files

Color Reproduction

Color art will be reproduced in the online production at no additional cost to the author. Color illustrations will also be considered for the print publication; however, the author will bear the full cost involved in color art reproduction. Please note that color reprints can only be ordered if the print reproduction costs are paid. Print Rates: \$900 for the first page of color; \$450 for the next 3 pages of color. A custom quote will be provided for authors with more than 4 pages of color. Art not supplied at a minimum of 300 dpi will not be considered for print.

Tables and Figures

Tables and figures (illustrations) should not be embedded in the text, but should be included as separate sheets or files. A short descriptive title should appear above each table with a clear legend and any footnotes suitably identified below. All units must be included. Figures should be completely labeled, taking into account necessary size reduction. Captions should be typed, double-spaced, on a separate sheet.

References

References should be double-spaced and numbered according to their order in the text. In the text, the references should appear as superscript Arabic numerals. Parenthetical references are

not acceptable. Journal titles should conform to Index Medicus (National Library of Medicine) style. Sample references are illustrated below:

Proofs

Page proofs are sent to the designated author using Taylor & Francis' Central Article Tracking System (CATS). They must be carefully checked and returned within 48 hours of receipt.

Open Access
